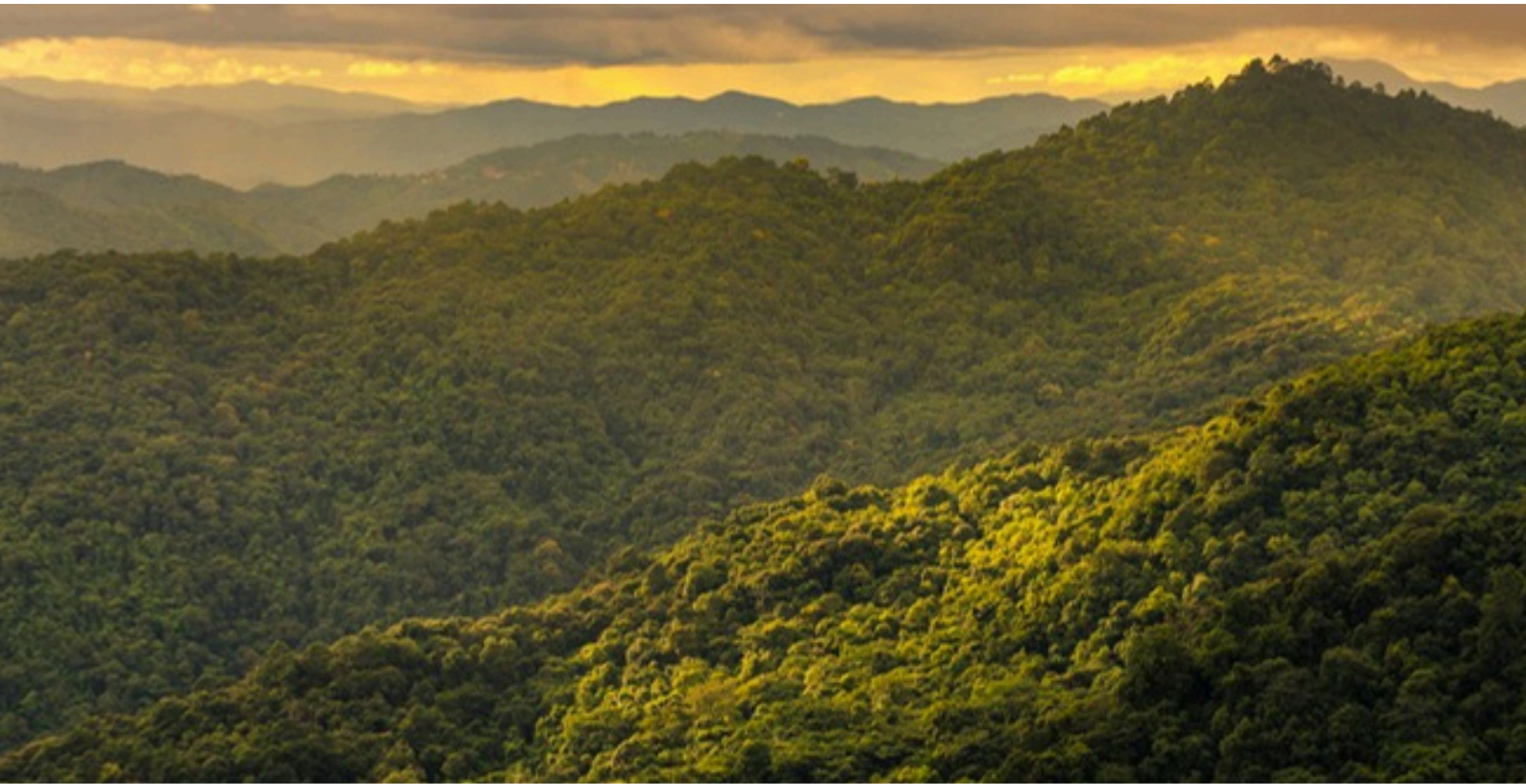

Description: A sophisticated evolution of the classic citrus profile. It opens with a vibrant, citrusy-fresh top note reminiscent of citronella, which swiftly transitions into a complex heart of rosé geranium and spicy nutmeg. The dry-down is remarkably distinct, offering a clean leathery accord with smoky, wood-fire undertones and a peculiar candied ginger warmth.

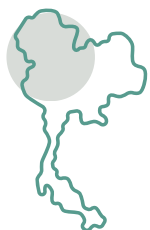

USAGE

Ta Krai Ton is a plant that produce fruit only once a year. Hill tribes in Thailand commonly use the fruit as a spice in cooking or eating it with Laap (a spicy minced meat salad) to neutralize the gamey smell. We purchased the produce from villagers in the mountains of Chiang Mai that have a roasting pre-treatment which gives it this unique roasted and smokey scent .

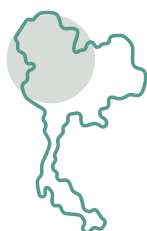

In the Lanna culture, Cape Jasmine is a popular choice to be grown in households gardens due to its auspicious symbolism. The white color of the Gardenia flower represents purity of mind, while its sweet fragrance symbolizes the fragrance of morality. For these reasons, Lanna people often offer Gardenia flowers as a form of Buddhist worship. Nowadays, it is common for locals to harvest the flowers in the morning and sell them at local morning markets.

During the Songkran festival, northern people like to use dried Sarapee flowers to make Sompoi water. It is believed to be holy water used to bathe Buddha statues.
